**Time to Donate to Fisher House**

For 30 years, the Fisher House program has provided “a home away from home” for families of patients receiving medical care at major military and VA medical centers. These homes offer free, temporary lodging to military and veterans’ families, allowing them to be close to their loved one during a medical crisis and focus on what’s important – the healing process. There are 91 Fisher Houses located in the US, Germany and United Kingdom. We are fortunate to have two on JBLM. Fisher House Foundation receives 4 out of 4 stars from Charity Navigator and an A+ grade from Charity Watch. JBLM Fisher Houses have a total of nineteen guest suites plus living room, dining room, pantry, kitchen and laundry facilities and an onsite playground. They served 93 families in FY21.

Fisher House depends on donations from individuals and organizations, such as Olympia Area MOAA, for the bulk of its funding. They also rely on the support of volunteers to help keep their houses feeling like homes, to assist in fundraising efforts, and to explore donation options. ALTERNATE PAYMENT OPTION: Members can pay dues and make charitable donations online. Dues can be paid for one, two or three years. This tool also allows for a maximum donation of \$100. ### August Chapter Meeting

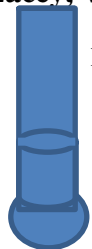
We will meet at the Red Lion/Olympia Hotel, 2300 Evergreen Park Dr, Olympia, WA, on **Wednesday, 17 August**. We **gather at 5:30** for social, with dinner served at 6:00. We ask that everyone RSVP and place their orders ahead of time. The cost for the dinner will be **\$28 per person**. The fee will include pre-set water/iced tea, coffee service, starter salad, garlic bread, chef's choice dessert, choice of one of three entrees: chicken parmesan with fettuccini alfredo, lasagna with meat sauce, or portobello mushroom ravioli with garlic cream sauce, all of which are served with roasted seasonal vegetables. The price includes tax and tip.

I have modified our usual dues/charity contribution form to include a dinner RSVP/order line. You can print/cut it out and mail it to the chapter mailbox with your RSVP/dinner order. ### **Surviving Spouse Corner – Military Retirees and Dependents with ID Cards that Don't Expire Need to Get Replacements within 4 Years**

Retirees and military family members who have identification cards with no expiration date can choose to upgrade to the new Next Generation Uniform Services Identification, or USID, cards whenever it's convenient – as long as it's done within the next four years, according to the Defense Department. There is no looming deadline for use of those old non-active duty cards without expiration dates, but the department expects to completely phase out and replace them with the next-generation IDs, which are more durable and have enhanced security features, by 2026.

DoD plans to phase out and cancel the existing card forms in 2026 when all existing cards with an actual expiration date will have expired. After then, only the USID card will be accepted for installation and benefits access. Social distancing and other pandemic safety precautions at DoD ID card sites worldwide delayed the progress of existing card replacement for a time, but generally most of those cardholders who needed to replace an expired card have done so at this point.

The department recommends that those with old ID cards with no expiration date replace these cards at their convenience by going to "ID Card Office Online" (type that into your internet search engine without the quotation marks, or click on <https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco/>) and make an appointment at your nearest convenient ID card issuing office.
