Stu was one of my US Army War College Seminar mentors and, although we managed to overload the local WIFI/ internet connection, our Zoom session was well received. In attendance were two of our scholarship winners and their guests, who were fascinated by COL Harrington's presentation and expressed a desire to learn more about the history of US involvement in Vietnam.
