2025 By-Law Changes

The Olympia Area Chapter Board of Directors are recommending changes to the current chapter bylaws. In addition to grammatical, clarification and updating language, and other non-substantive changes, the following substantive changes are recommended.

- Article III, Section 6. Records Management. Changes the current requirement that all documents be maintained for 6 years to a requirement that records shall be maintained in accordance with the chapter's records management policy, which is currently being finalized. This policy will require all financial records to be maintained for 7 years, will maintain historical records permanently, and allow transient records to be destroyed in 6 years or less. The policy will be provided to all chapter members once approved by the board.

2025 By-Law Changes

- Article IV, Membership.
 - Section 1.(a). - Added Space Force to list of services.
 - Section 4.(A) d. - removed confusing language related to verification of membership applications.
 - Section 4.(B) - clarified that recommendations for honorary membership can be submitted by the board directors and officers, as well as chapter members.

2025 By-Law Changes

- Article VIII, Board of Directors
 - Section 2(a). Changed when directors take office from next regular board meeting to the first board meeting in January, establishing the term as a one calendar year term.
 - Section 2(b). Added the ability for a vacant position on the board to be filled by election of a member at the next annual meeting, to serve to the remaining period of the term. This is in addition to the current ability of the board to appoint a member to a vacant position.
 - Section 5. Made it clear that board meetings can be held in person, by electronic means or a combination of both.
 - Section 9. Made it clear that voting by the board may occur by email, in accordance with chapter policy. The board will develop and approve a voting policy that provides the process for voting by email.

2025 By-Law Changes

- Article IX, Officers
 - Section 2. Changed when officers take office from next regular board meeting to the first board meeting in January. Establishing calendar year terms.
 - Section 7. Clarified the Secretary's duties to include the maintenance of records in accordance with the records management policy.

2025 By-Law Changes

- Article X, Committees.
 - Section 2. Simplified the committee structure to conform with current practice to provide greater flexibility by removing all the named committees with their attendant duties and replacing with the board establishing the process for creating committees by establishing a committee policy and listing some requirements that must be in the policy.
 - Section 4. Clarified the appointment of liaisons and removed the list of organizations for which liaisons are currently appointed, to provide greater flexibility and remove the need to amend the bylaws when organizations change.
